

HOMELESSNESS

is experienced by **people** ...

... without conventional accommodation (e.g. sleeping rough or in improvised dwellings);

... staying in accommodation that falls below minimum community standards (e.g. boarding housing and caravan parks).

... who frequently move from one temporary shelter to another (e.g. emergency accommodation, Youth, refugees, "couch surfing")

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Since 2019, there has been a 25% increase in the priority wait list for Victorian public housing register on the Mornington Peninsula (from 981 in 2019 to 1225 in 2022.)



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1 in 4 rental homes on the Mornington Peninsula are only available for tourism (short stay) - approximately 4000 homes
